Title Events Organization

The organizers of Title-awarding events, Continental and Worldwide for Full /Kick/K1/Light Contact/Kick Light, must apply to the WMKF secretariat for a licence, no less, than 90 days before the event and pay the relevant fee.

Organizers must pay all travel and hotel accommodation expenses for the *"Federal Delegate"*, who must attend the event to give official recognition to the Title and to present the Belt and Certificate to the winner. The € 100.- attendance fee will be paid by the WMKF.

The WMKF will appoint a referee and three judges to oversee the matches of the event.

The organizers will be responsible for purchasing the flight tickets (where applicable), or reimburse travel expenses, hotel accommodation and meals, and for the € 80.- attendance fee for these officials.

WMKF Royalties, must be paid to the WMKF bank account in Geneva (Switzerland) at the same time as the application for a licence is made.

It is the responsibility of the organizers to pay for the following:

- Travel expenses for athletes and coaches (one for each athlete);
- Hotel accommodation and food;
- Transfer from airport to hotel and from hotel to event location (where applicable)
- Reimbursement for the reigning Champion and for the challenger, as agreed beforehand.

All dues will be paid to referees and athletes no later than two hours before the start of the event.

A physician must be in attendance at the event, together with a paramedic, an assistant and an ambulance with resuscitation equipment.
